# Follow up – it's not “just” a mandate

## How follow up impacts outcomes

- Crucial for Entered Employment common measure
- System closures – the only place we can capture outcomes
- Exits prior to completion of training – capturing credentials
- New placement and/or wage info
- Retention - a full year

# Timeliness of data entry impacts all program outcomes

- Missing training credentials = **FTM**
- System closures – losing control over exit strategies and NOT capturing outcomes in F/U = **FTM**
- Missing Literacy Numeracy Gains – **FTM**
- Follow up employment not captured in 1<sup>st</sup> Quarter F/U – **FTM**
- Average Earnings - placement wages not entered – **FTM**
- Missing Youth Attainment of Degree – **FTM**



It is critical that **ALL** VOS data entry be entered and on a timely basis. Backdating and adding case notes of explanation opens our WIB up for additional scrutiny during auditing.

**System closures – losing control over exit strategies is the single cause of 95% of our FTM.**
